The idea for Showcase was raised in 1995 by band parent Debbie Reams, on a Fairfax County Connector bus ride with the band to do a halftime show for the football team now known as the Washington Commanders. The next parent meeting resulted in the birth of the Virginia Showcase of Bands, with the first show in the fall of 1997. 
Your host band, The Pride of Herndon, is recognized as the first band program in Fairfax County which then served as the model for future band programs throughout the County. The Pride was established by dedicated parents and citizens who convinced Vladamir Johnson, a Russian interpreter and part-time music teacher from Washington, D.C., to rehearse with a group of fledgling musicians in the rural town of Herndon.

Just as The Pride of Herndon and Showcase relied on the support of parents and volunteers in the early days, today's event would not have been possible without support from our local businesses, the Town of Herndon, Fairfax County government, and Herndon High School's faculty and staff. In addition, the time and dedication of the HHSBPA, especially those who served on the Showcase Event Team, is invaluable. VMBC contracts premier judges throughout the US and Canada to judge its shows and to deliver educational verbal input through digital commentary and to generate accurate scoring and rankings. The evaluation of each band's show design and resulting performance is based primarily on MUSIC and VISUAL. Percussion and Color Guard will also be judged at VMBC Championships in 2022.

#### VMBC CAPTIONS AND WEIGHTINGS

Ensemble Music	20%	Focus is on the technical components of the show which include the musical composition, excellence, sound quality, technique, and musicianship for the group.
Ensemble Visual	20%	Focus is on the technical components of the show which include the visual composition, excellence, technique, form, body movement, and auxiliary contributions.
General Effect Music	20%	Focus is on the artistry components of the show which include the effectiveness of the musical repertoire, performance, expressive qualities, pacing, and communication.
General Effect Visual	20%	Focus is on the artistry components of the show which include the effectiveness of the visual repertoire, performance, expressive qualities, pacing, and communication.
Individual Music	10%	Focus is placed on the individual technical and musical components from the winds and percussion composition and excellence. This is evaluated at the field level.
Individual Visual	10%	Focus is placed on the individual technical and visual components from the winds, percussion, and auxiliary composition and excellence. This is evaluated at the field level.
Color Guard and Percussion		Additional detailed focus is provided to these sections regarding their composition and excellence and how they contribute to the entire production. These captions are judged from the box and scores are NOT factored into the total placement.

#### MUSIC

Music caption winners are determined by adding the Ensemble Music and Individual Music scores.

#### VISUAL

Visual caption winners are determined by adding the Ensemble Visual and Individual Visual scores.

#### **GENERAL EFFECT**

General Effect caption winners are determined by adding the Music GE and Visual GE scores.

#### PERCUSSION AND GUARD

Percussion and Guard caption winners are determined by score on their respective sheets.

NOTE: Each judge ultimately evaluates "what" is being delivered by the students along with "how well" the show is being performed. The two sub-captions are weighted equally on each scoring sheet. This judging system, which is based on achievement, was designed to provide the audience with an enjoyable and entertaining marching band show which rewards artistic quality as well as providing a positive educational environment for the performers.

## FAQ FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

#### **CAN I CHEER DURING THE PERFORMANCE?**

Cheering is part of the whole experience; so, of course, you can cheer. The bands love to hear the crowd respond to the great music and precise drill execution. Remember, though, cheering at the wrong time is distracting and may unnerve some of the performers. So, give the performers all the positive feedback they deserve while on the field.

#### WHAT IS THE BEST WAY TO ENJOY THE PERFORMANCES?

Be an active audience member. If you see something you like during a performance, applaud or cheer. After the performance, if you see a band member, congratulate them on a great performance. And don't forget to congratulate the band directors. They work especially hard in the marching competition season.

#### WHAT IS THE RAIN PLAN?

In the event of inclement weather VMBC and Herndon Event Coordinator will contact directors with delay, standstill, indoor performance or cancellation scenarios.

#### WHERE IS THE BATHROOM?

Bathrooms are located by the concessions stand just inside the entrance of the stadium.



## **GLOSSARY** OF MARCHING BAND TERMS

**Auxiliary** • The term originally used for the flag/rifle carriers who stood at the front of marching show. Evolved into modern Color Guard when dance and decorative flags were added. Now known as Guard or Color Guard; see Guard/Color Guard for more details.

**Battery** • Marching Band percussion section that carries drums and marches; is comprised of snaredrums, bass drums, and quads (see Quads).

**Cadence** • The beat played by percussion during a parade to indicate the marching pace. Also played as the band marches off the field after a field show or rehearsal.

**Clinicians** • Personnel hired to help out with various sections of the band, as in brass instructor or drumline instructor.

**Drill** • The steps and positions that make up the Marching Band show. (see Sets)

**Drill Book** • The notebook that holds each individual student's drill for the Marching Band show.

**Drill Down** • A marching skills contest conducted along the lines of "Simon Says."

**Drum Major(s)** • Student conductor(s) who direct the marching band as it plays.

**Drumline** • The entire percussion section of the Marching Band; includes both the front ensemble and the Battery.

**Flags** • Flags/silks used by the Guard during a Marching Band show.

**Front Ensemble** • Marching Band percussion section that does not march but rather plays on the sidelines and are staged at the front of the band during marching competitions. It is comprised of instruments such as tympani, xylophones, gongs, etc.

**Guard** • A group of students who add color and style to marching band performances with flags and other props. Formerly know as Auxiliary, the term originally used for the flag/rifle carriers who stood at the front of marching show that evolved into modern-day color guard when dance and decorative flags were added. **Pep Band** • Small subset of the band that plays for the away football games.

**Pit** • The front ensemble in a band, also known as pit, is a percussion section that stands in front of the band and does not march. This is because the instruments played by the front ensemble, unlike those played by drumline, are too big to be marched.

**Plumes** • The feathered portion of the Marching Band hats (very fragile)

**Podium** • Raised platform upon which conductors stand, also know as Tower.

**Quads** • Set of 4 connected drums carried by member of the battery. Also known as Tenors or Tenor Drums.

**Rifles** • Imitation rifles the Guard use in a Marching Band show.

**Run-through** • Practicing the Marching Band show.

**Sabers** • Fake swords that the Guard uses in a Marching Band show.

**Section** • Students who play the same instruments, i.e. the trumpet section.

**Section Leader** • Band student who is in charge of a Marching Band instrument section; such as "alto sax section leader."

**Sectional** • A practice or rehearsal by a section of instruments.

Sets • Sub-set of the shows.

**Step Off** • The precise moment when a Marching Band parade performance starts.

**Tenor Drums** • Set of 4-6 connected drums carried by member of the battery, also known as Quads

**Tower** • Raised platform upon which conductors stand, also known as Podium.

**Winds** • The non-percussion part of the band; any instrument that is played by blowing air.
